Alongside this revised curriculum structure, we have also introduced a new Inclusion Faculty which brings together the work of our pastoral, learning support and early help teams. This faculty is led by Mrs Ridley (Deputy Headteacher) and will further strengthen all aspects of our inclusion services. As part of this new structure, we now have two non-teaching Heads of Year (Year 7 and Year 10). Heads of Year from other groups are supported by a Pastoral Support Assistant (PSA).
