

Y11 Parents' Evening - German GCSE Information Sheet

Examination Information:

GCSE German is assessed at Foundation Tier (grades 1-5) **OR** Higher Tier (grades 4-9). All question papers must be taken at the same tier. Students are examined in four skill areas; Speaking, Writing, Listening and Reading.

The Speaking Paper is conducted by the class teacher and marked by an AQA examiner. It consists of three parts – a role play, a photo-card and a general conversation.

The Writing Paper is assessed by final examination. It comprises structured tasks (including an element of choice) and a translation into German.

The Listening Paper is assessed by final examination and comprises questions answered in German and English.

The Reading Paper is assessed by final examination and comprises reading comprehension questions answered in German and English. There is also a translation into English on the reading paper.

How you can support your child:

A quiet space to work and a regular routine for completing homework and revision are highly recommended. There is a GCSE German catch-up/revision session on Friday lunchtime in L3.

In order to achieve the best possible overall grade for their German GCSE we strongly recommend that students get into the habit of regular revision from now onwards, if they are not already doing so. 15 minutes a day will significantly enhance their knowledge, skills and confidence with the language. This could be spent revising from their book, using the revision and grammar and translation resources provided last year, checking Moodle for further resources or revising from one of the many websites, which are available to them.

Learning a set amount of vocabulary each week and recapping the tenses we have covered are both vital to obtaining a good grade. Please do encourage your child to learn the key vocabulary for the short tests we have in school each week and test them on these vocabulary items where possible.
