Reading remains a key priority at Lady Manners School. We were delighted that this was recognised in our recent Ofsted inspection report:

'The school has prioritised reading. Pupils who need extra help to gain the skills and knowledge to read receive well thought out support. In key stage 3, pupils read regularly in lessons, which supports them in developing a love of reading'.

A particularly successful aspect of our programme is the 'buddy reading' scheme which involves a selection of Sixth Form students working closely to support the reading of their younger peers. Students and mentors meet twice a week during form time and thrive within a positive and inclusive learning environment.


School Officers

Faculty in Focus: Computing and Technology



Year 12 A Level Product Design students have been responding to a brief to design and make a table light. They have demonstrated excellent knowledge, design flair and commitment and have developed an innovative range of high-quality products that fit the brief.

Our excellent **Year 7 Design and Technology students** are completing their new 'Flip-tastic' toys. They have designed some amazing characters and used their manufacturing and engineering skills to cut, drill and thread their plywood, pine and brass materials successfully.



Year 10 GCSE Food Technology students have been learning about industrial food production methods. To help demonstrate their understanding, they examined the function of the ingredients and processes involved in soft cheese production, and then went on to make a batch of soft cheese. It was fascinating to see the process in the classroom.
