Welcome to our Christmas newsletter!

As usual, this has been a busy time in the school year. Many activities have taken place throughout the term and students have performed with distinction in high profile events both within school and in the wider community. Congratulations to all students on their excellent achievements so far during this academic year.

# **Inclusion Faculty**



The school continues to develop and we have made changes to our Inclusion Faculty that we believe will benefit our current and future students. This includes our approach to student wellbeing and the role of key professionals within our inclusion staffing structure. A newly restructured Inclusion Faculty will be introduced from January 2026. This Faculty will be led by Mrs Ridley (Deputy Headteacher, Inclusion).

The new structure will bring together the work of the school's pastoral, early help and learning support teams. A fundamental priority in developing this restructured model has been to ensure that key leaders are primarily non-teaching professionals. This will provide staff with more time to deal with issues expeditiously during a school day, rather than having to work around heavy teaching commitments. New appointments in a number of key positions are already in place, including Year Leader roles, although Mr Martin (Head of Year 11) and Miss Howarth (Year 11 PSA) will remain with their current year group until the end of the academic year.



Congratulations to Mrs Hobday who was appointed as our Inclusion Leader for Safeguarding and Wellbeing this week. Mrs Taberner, who already works at the school, will take over the Year Leader role for Year 9 on a temporary basis from the start of January. We wish both colleagues well in their new positions.

A graduated approach will always be used to deal with inclusion issues with clear lines of communication that should be followed. This ensures that concerns are directed to the correct person or team quickly and appropriate support can be put in place at the right level to avoid issues escalating. We have highly skilled and experienced specialists in place to deal with specific issues across different year groups. Any initial contact with senior leaders will always be re-directed to the most appropriate person or team of people.

Most concerns are addressed successfully at a very early stage, and issues rarely escalate to a higher level. Staff will always take your concerns seriously and will aim to resolve all issues in an informal manner. On the rare occasions where this is not possible, clear policies and procedures will be followed.

A polite reminder that **the first point of contact** should always be your child's Form Tutor. You can contact the relevant tutor via email with their first initial and last name, followed by @ladymanners.derbyshire.sch.uk, eg <u>jbloggs@ladymanners.derbyshire.sch.uk</u>. If you ever need to visit our school, please ensure that you have made an appointment first. A reminder that all visitors must sign in at reception. Any person visiting the site without an appointment will be asked to leave. Unaccompanied visitors are not allowed on site for safeguarding reasons. Thank you for your cooperation regarding this matter.

#### Remembrance Service

We held our annual Remembrance Service on Tuesday 11 November. As always, this was a poignant occasion which was impeccably observed by students across all age groups. This year we remembered former student, Samuel Sheldon, who was tragically killed by machine gun fire in 'No Man's Land' within a few moments of leaving a trench near the village of Serre in France. Samuel was just 23 years old and sadly his body was never recovered.

I would like to thank our history teacher, Mr Roberts, who once again delivered an outstanding assembly for Year 7 and Year 8 students to commemorate our former military students. This enabled our younger learners to appreciate the sacrifices made by the brave soldiers who attended Lady Manners School.

# **Drama Production: The Railway Children**

Students across a range of year groups gave an outstanding performance of 'The Railway Children' in November. Performers and wider cast members showcased their talents superbly across three evenings and their efforts were appreciated by large audiences. I was particularly impressed by the fluent French and Russian that was spoken during the performance – and with the number of accurate regional accents delivered by the cast.

Staff from the Creative Arts Faculty worked energetically to make this ambitious production such an innovative and engaging event. Lighting, special effects, props and costumes were outstanding and certainly enhanced the audience experience.

Congratulations to Year 12 student Emelia, who studies the Double Bass and French Horn at the Junior Royal Northern College of Music (JRNCM). Emelia has recently passed her Diploma in Double Bass with a Distinction. The exam comprised a 30-minute programme in which musicality, performance and skill had to be shown. She prepared for the exam with numerous performances to Bakewell Methodist School, Valley Lodge Care Home, S. Anselm's School and her peers at the JRNCM. She is now working on perfecting the pieces for the Diploma on the French Horn and her Grade 8 singing.

# **Careers Update**

This term students across the school have learned about different career roles, including an interpreter, a jewellery designer, a life coach, an oceanographer, a prison officer, a secretary and a toxicologist. Students learn what the job entails, the qualifications and skills needed, and the expected level of salary.

In addition, our Year 8 students took part in the STEM learning 'Protect our Planet Day' online event. Year 10 students had an assembly to start thinking about their post-16 choices after Year 11, including A Levels, vocational qualifications, T Levels and Apprenticeships.

Year 11 students have been enjoying post-16 taster sessions in the Sixth Form, as well as having their one-to-one careers guidance meetings with Mr Pacey to discuss their next steps and long-term career aspirations. Career Plans are shared with students and their parents/carers via Class Charts.

It has also been an exciting time for Year 13 students making choices about their next steps. Students considering university have submitted their UCAS applications and Mrs Bortoli (Careers Leader) ran a 'CV Writing for Degree Apprenticeships' assembly and workshop for students considering this route. # **Faculty in Focus: Global Studies**

#### Geography



Year 12 A Level Geography students gain valuable experience through fieldwork and research. They recently completed a two-day residential trip to Liverpool, investigating the city's changing character. Staying overnight in Liverpool and after enjoying a full English breakfast, the students spent time investigating Formby and Ainsdale sand dunes.

Students also attend a taster day at Sheffield Hallam University before completing independent investigations on their chosen

geographical topics- currently in the final stages of completion for Year 13.

# **History**



A Level History students have enjoyed several enriching trips recently. Our current Year 13 students visited Chester and Conwy, as part of their coursework, exploring Norman architecture at Chester Cathedral and Edward I's castle at Conwy. Current Year 12 students explored Manchester in October, visiting nineteenth-century warehouses, the first post-Reformation Catholic church, the People's History Museum, and a recreated Roman fort. The annual London trip included discussions about the Benin bronzes at the British Museum, plus visits to the National Portrait Gallery and Westminster Abbey, featuring Edward I's coronation chair.

# Languages



The Languages team launched the year with European Day of Languages celebrations. Special assemblies showcased staff language skills and highlighted former students' global destinations - from China to Brazil - following on from their language studies at Lady Manners School. Students also participated in a school-wide quiz, finding staff's favourite words in different languages and translating our school values into French, German and Spanish. Over 20 entries were received for the baking

competition, whilst designs were received from students across Years 7-9 for our T-shirt logo competition. Beyond school, Year 10 students have enjoyed trips to France, Spain and Germany, whilst Year 13 students recently had a great experience visiting Berlin.
